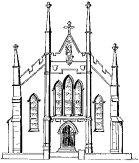

#### READINGS FOR TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - 18<sup>th</sup> August

##### *We shall keep running steadily...*

Today's readings are about the cost of discipleship. Such a cost is not what we want to hear. We don't want to hear that choosing Christ will put our lives so at odds with those around us that we will be persecuted and mocked. We want our religion to be easy. We don't want to have to pay a price for living our faith. But we must. We have chosen Christ therefore we must make difficult decisions in order to be the *People of God*, not just slaves to the world. We accept this cost because we are more concerned with others than ourselves. We are concerned for their eternal salvation not so much with what they can do to us in this life. In today's Gospel Jesus says, *I have come to fire to the earth, and how I wish it were ablaze already!* The fire is the fire of God's love. That is what we are about. We know we are loved. We know that God wants others to join us in His Love. If we are truly going to be His disciples, then we will happily join the Lord in setting the world on fire with love. And we will do this no matter what personal cost this entails: For the cost of discipleship is temporary, but the Treasure of God's Love is forever.

#### READINGS FOR TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - 25<sup>th</sup> August

##### *When the Lord corrects you do not treat it lightly...*

Jesus speaks about the sin of presumption in today's Gospel. Some people are not willing to make any sacrifices for the Kingdom of God, in spite of the opportunities offered to them throughout their lives. They stubbornly ignore the call to follow Christ by the *narrow door*, and instead choose the wide door, the door - the *everybody is doing it so it's OK* - the crowd prefers. When they knock on the door of the Master's House, it's too late. The door has been shut, their earthly lives are over. They demand entrance into Heaven presuming they are entitled to a warm welcome into God's eternal Presence. But they have presumed His Mercy would be there for them without them ever having lifted a finger to serve Him. Instead they hear the Master saying, *Away from me you wicked men*. We cannot presume we will have a heavenly reward. We cannot presume that we are entitled to eternal glory without committing ourselves to Him here and now. Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, live His Life, trust in His mercy and follow Him wherever He leads us.

*... do not get discouraged when He reprimands you!*
